

Where do Kansas City's Workers Live?

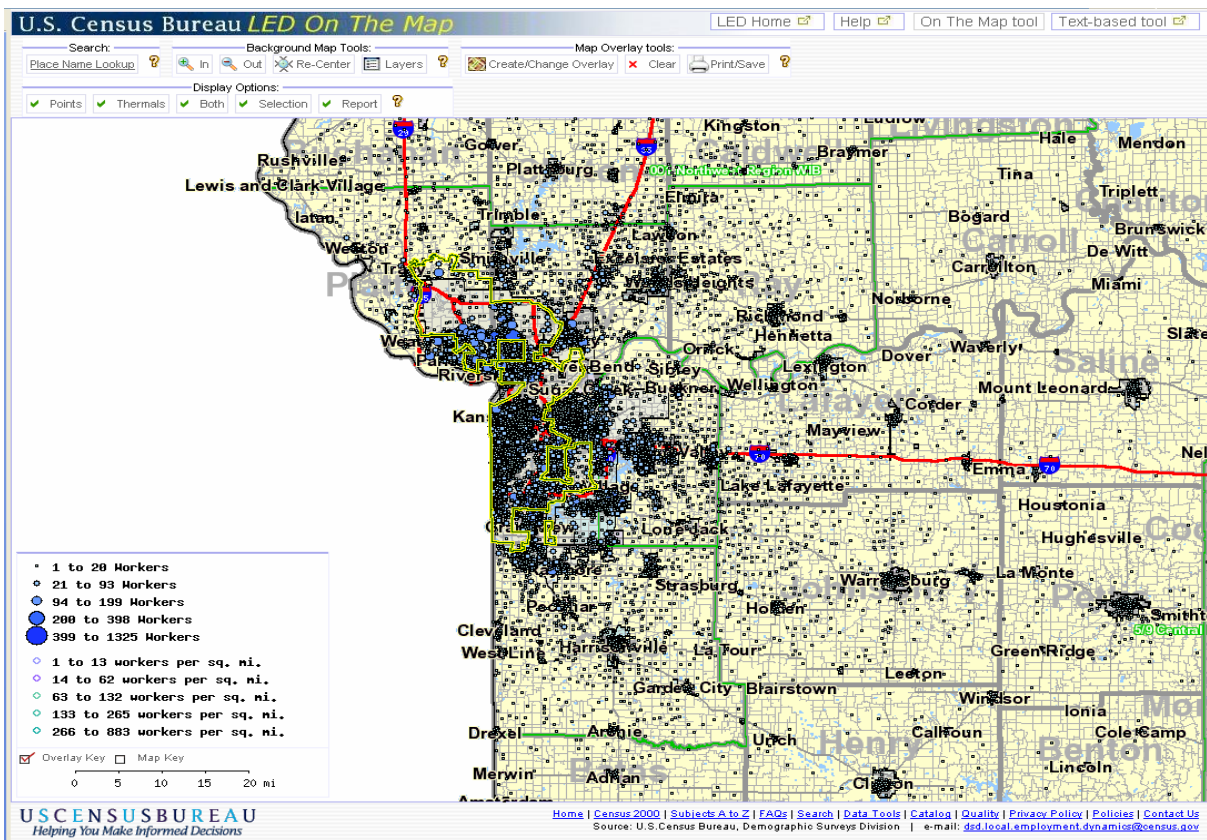
Kansas City draws 27.1% of its workers from Kansas City. It is notable that Kansas City draws 38% of its workforce from outside of Missouri. Jackson County, where the largest portion of Kansas City is located, accounts for 31.7% of all employees, while Clay County accounts for 11.9% of all employees.

The Local Employment Dynamics (LED) program is a partnership between the U.S. Census Bureau and the agencies in each state that generate and analyze labor market information. The LED On-the-Map tool allows you to designate either an area where workers work and determine where they live, or designate where residents live and determine where those workers commute.

What Industries Employ Kansas City Workers?

The distribution of private sector jobs in Kansas City is broadly mixed. Health care and social assistance, retail trade, manufacturing, accommodations and food services, and professional, scientific, and technical services round out the top five industries which, when combined, account for 50.7% of employment.

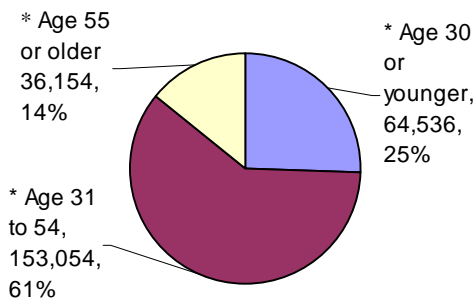
