



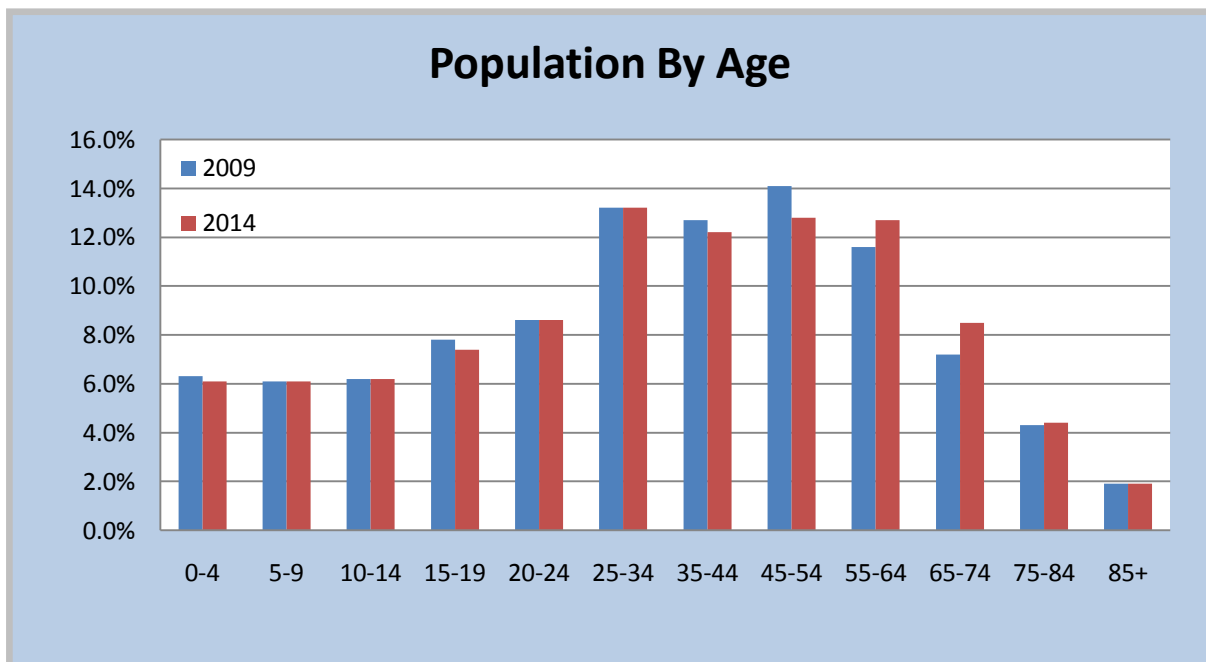
# Central WIA Region Demographic Summary

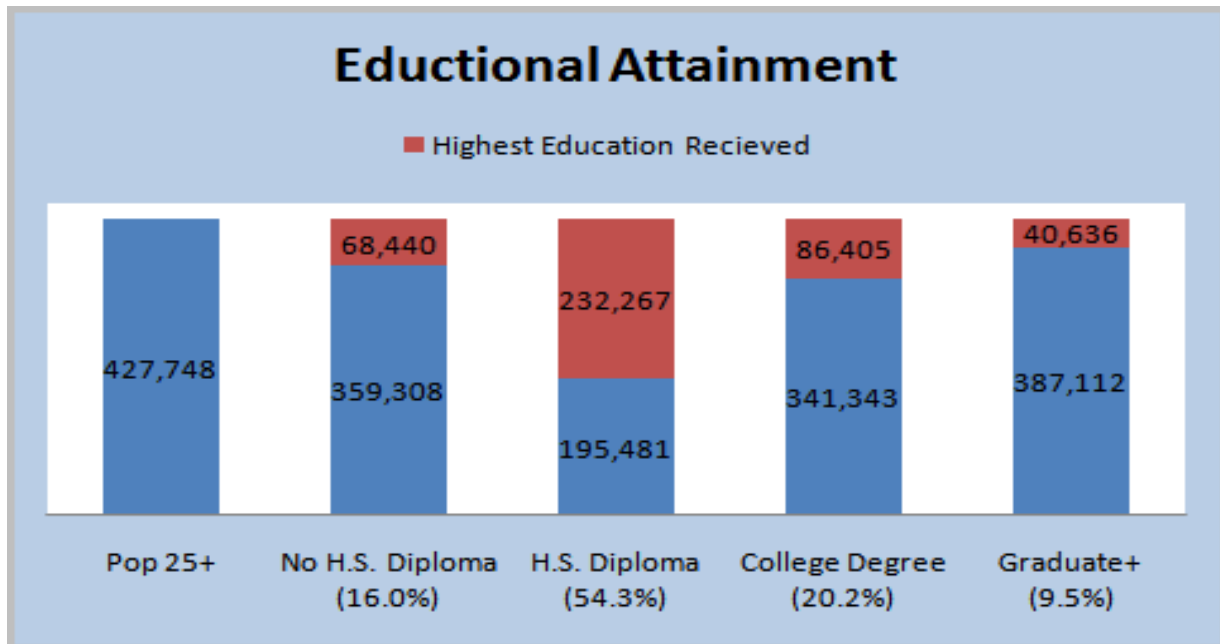
