



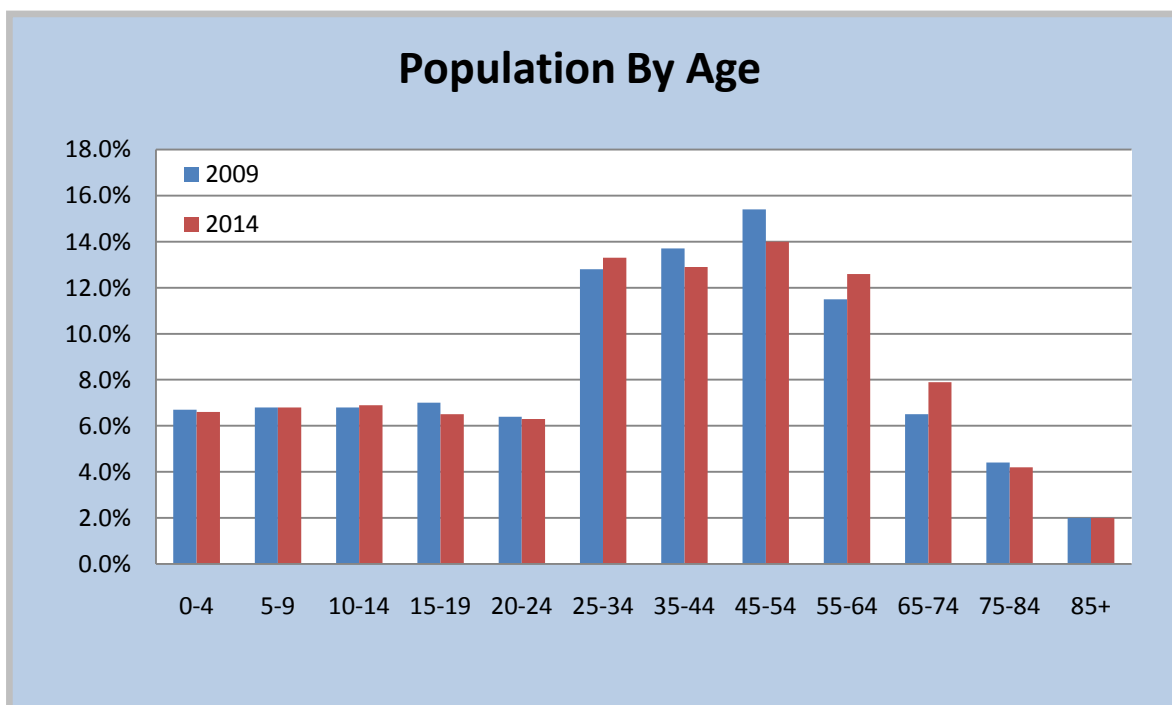
Saint Louis WIA Region Demographic Summary

The Saint Louis region of Missouri encompasses the largest populated area in the state, the highest per capita income, well above national levels, and educational attainment that exceed the U.S. average. However, the area is expected to grow at about half the rate as the rest of the country over the next five years. 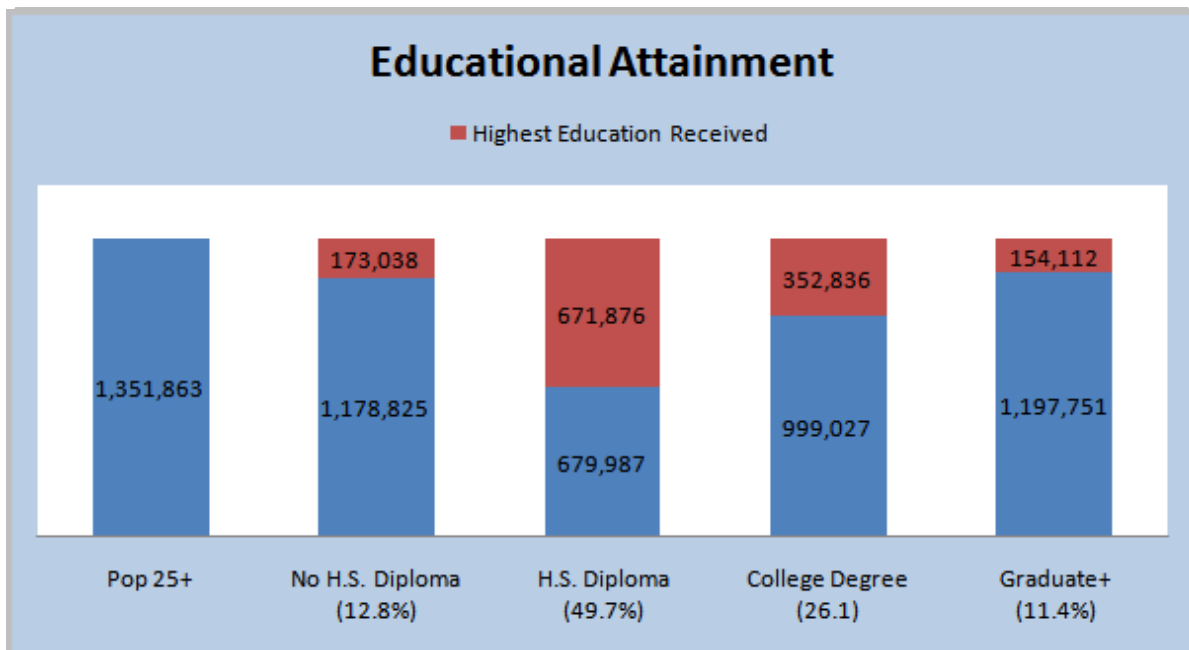
