



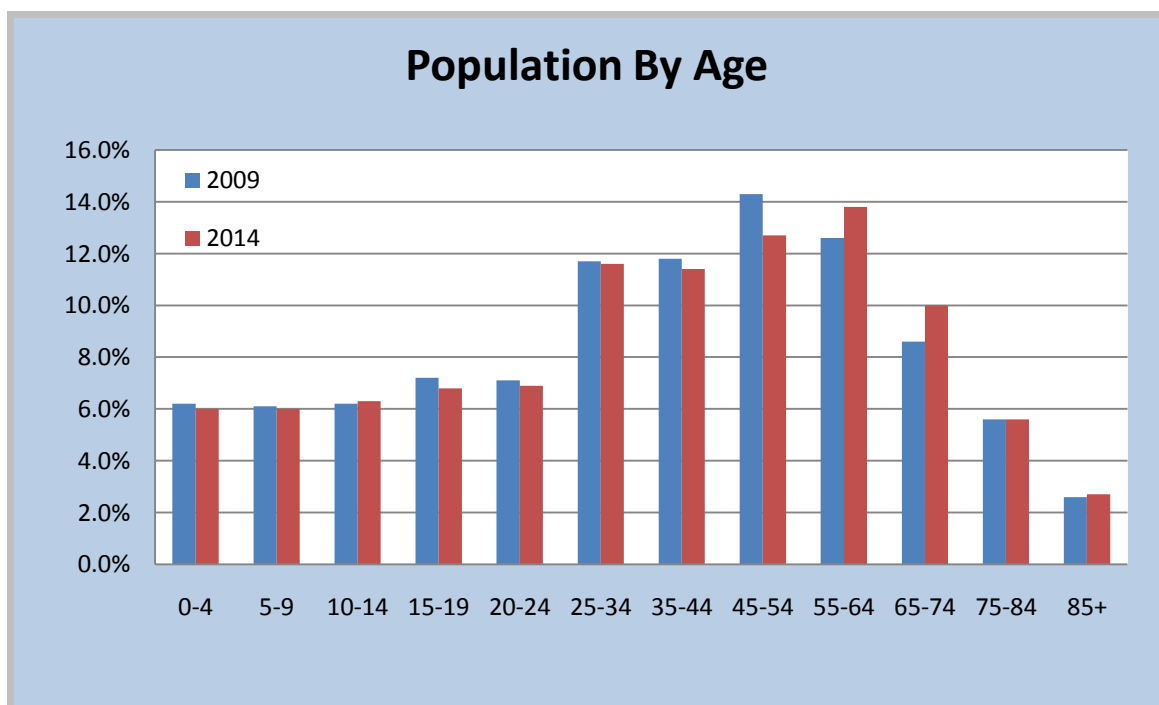
West Central WIA Region Demographic Summary

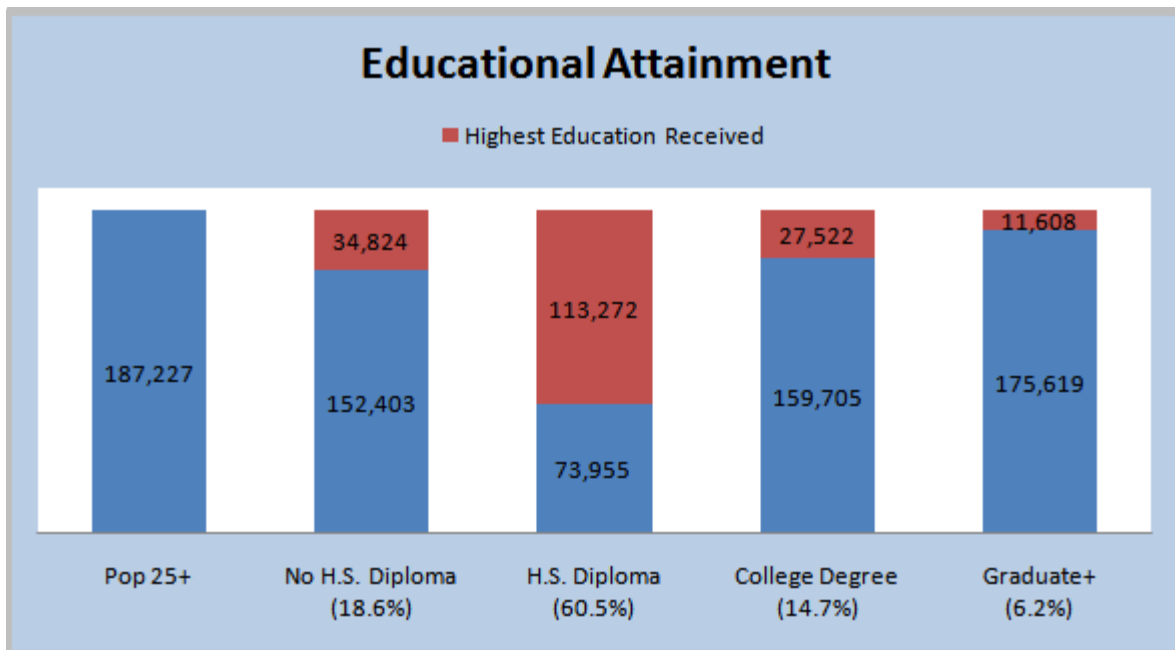
