

St. Louis Region Fastest Growing Occupations

2017-2019

The St. Louis region is projected to have a net increase of more than 19,000 jobs between 2017 and 2019. This net increase in jobs results in growth openings, which occur when an occupation grows between the base year and projected year. Of the top 20 occupations that are projected to have the highest percentage growth, 4 are in the *Healthcare Support* occupation group. The *Community and Social Service* and *Healthcare Practitioners and Technical* major occupation groups have 3 occupations each in the top 20 fastest growing occupations.
